GALA FOR THE ARTS HONOREE: INSPIRATION AWARD

Gretsch drums and guitars are the preferred instruments of many studio musicians and recording artists. Fred and Dinah Gretsch have consistently supported a variety of

music education initiatives in an attempt to “enrich people’s lives through participation in music” – the stated purpose behind The Gretsch Foundation, the charitable arm of the family. Savannah-Chatham Public Schools have benefited from the Gretsch family in their support of the arts to include a \$150,000 dollar donation to supply band uniforms for the District’s *All Honors Band*; funding to support the launch of Piano Labs at Haven Elementary and Godley Station; and in 2014 the Savannah Arts Academy was recognized for excellence in music education through the prestigious *GRAMMY® Foundation’s Signature Schools Enterprise Award*, which was presented by Fred and Dinah Gretsch on behalf of the Grammy Foundation.

Thomas B. Lockamy, Jr., Ed.D., served as the Superintendent of Schools for the Savannah-Chatham County Public School System from July of 2005 until his retirement in May of 2017. Under Dr. Lockamy’s leadership, schools have experienced award winning turnarounds and more families have turned to the public school system as their first choice in education. Part of the success and growth over the last decade lies in the commitment to place the arts as a strategic educational priority. We are proud to recognize his vision and leadership that has helped define the success of Savannah-Chatham Public Schools over the past decade – one that has been grounded in the belief that the arts play a critical role in education serving to ignite a passion for learning in young minds.
